## Orpheus Island

Imagine waking up in one of the world's most exclusive private island destinations.

Located amidst the Great Barrier Reef and surrounded by 1,300 hectares of pristine national park, Orpheus Island is a nature lover's paradise. Strictly limited to 42 pampered guests and with the exclusion of telephones, televisions, day-trippers or children under 15, Orpheus provides the ultimate hideaway.

The waters off the island are home to a vast array of vibrant, coloured marine life, showcasing 1,100 species of fish and 340 of the 350 known species of reef coral. On Orpheus, the magnificence of an unspoilt island and its pristine beaches, tropical rainforests and fringing reefs are a mere backdrop to an experience in tropical food, wine and privacy like no other.

### Activities

There are a hundred ways to lose yourself at Orpheus. This is a place so private that snorkelling becomes a surreal experience as you glide over the world's largest population of giant clams. Discover myriad marine life as you snorkel or dive some of the finest reefs. Embark on a trip to the outer reef aboard the luxury 32-foot catamaran, *Orpheus*, for a sensational day on the water. Relax on your own private beach with a chef-prepared gourmet picnic hamper, take part in a unique nature interpretive activity, or simply relax by the pool and waste away the hours.

Dining is a relaxed and unforgettable highlight of the Orpheus experience, with all meals included in the daily tariff. Tropical fruits, local seafood's and exotic delicacies are served with flair and imagination – with spectacular ocean views and sunsets thrown in for good measure.

The resort's award-winning restaurant caters to the gourmet lover, offering an à la carte breakfast, alfresco courtyard lunch and, each evening, a seven-course degustation menu. Not to be missed is "Dining with the Tides", a private table set up for dining under the stars on the jetty.
